



18-014 Request for information on Hit and Run accident

On February 4, 2018, Englewood Police responded to the 3100 block of S. Acoma St. in reference to a hit and run accident. The officer completed an accident report and obtained a description of the run vehicle, no additional information was known at Shortly after completing the accident report, the officer received a that time. separate call for service about a possible stolen vehicle. He noted that the reported stolen vehicle matched the description of the run vehicle in the hit and run accident. The officer responded to a location that he believed the run vehicle might have gone and located a vehicle matching the description, additionally, he found that the vehicle had damage that was consistent with the accident. The registered owner of the vehicle was contacted and provided information that indicated the vehicle had not actually been stolen. The registered owner gave officers possible suspect information as well as insurance information for the vehicle that was later included in the accident report. Officers conducted a thorough search of the area but could not find the suspect. Further investigation revealed that the suspect was often transient and his whereabouts were unknown. A detective sergeant later reviewed the accident, and subsequent follow-up, and although it is likely that the previously identified suspect was responsible for the hit and run accident, that individual cannot be positively identified as being the driver at the time of the accident. Based on the information and evidence at this time there is no probable cause to request an arrest warrant for the suspect. If additional information comes to light that can positively identify the driver of the run vehicle this case will be re-opened and assigned to a detective for additional investigation.

Any person who has an interest in this incident, including those that are impacted by the incident and subsequent investigation can request a copy of the report through our Police Departments Records. Upon official request and after required redactions are made, reports that are subject to open records laws will be released.
