2021 at a Glance

In the first eight months of its existence, EDDA hit the ground running. After City Council adopted the Englewood Downtown Plan and approved the authority's funding, EDDA:

- Secured grant funding from the Colorado Department of Transportation to enhance the South Broadway paseos and crosswalk
- · Installed new banners along South Broadway
- Contracted cleanups along South Broadway and Old Hampden
- Received voter approval for long-term funding for large, multi-year Downtown projects and improvements
- Created basic marketing tools, including a website, e-newsletters, print newsletters and social media channels

Improved Paseos

The two paseos on South Broadway are now designated common consumption areas. That means you can order a to-go adult beverage from a permitted restaurant or bar and drink it with friends in the paseos. We'll also be adding new landscaping, lighting, bike racks and paint to make the paseos even more inviting. You'll see safety improve with new high-visibility crosswalk paint, bollard lights and signage. Watch for outdoor patios to reopen soon!

More Parking

Next time you drive Downtown, check out the new public parking lot at the southeast corner of Lincoln Street and Girard Avenue, across the street from the Malley Recreation Center. An extra 24 spaces make Downtown shopping, socializing and running errands easier.

New Apartments Underway

The Bullock Mortuary, along with several adjoining properties, were raised to make way for a 118-unit apartment building at 1375 East Hampden.





Swedish Hospital Cancer Center

Swedish Hospital has broken ground at 701/799 East Hampden Avenue. This \$25-million project will consolidate all cancer services and connect two existing buildings with a dramatic new lobby. To be completed by late 2022, the project will open the buildings to Hampden Avenue where the City and EDDA are planning utility, streetscape and mobility improvements to make Hampden a safer, more inviting corridor.
