CityCenter Project Reset

SKB and Tryba Architects have withdrawn from the CityCenter redevelopment project, citing uncertainty about project financing, rising interest rates and construction costs. The city and EDDA are pursuing new opportunities with other developers, looking for the best fit for both parties. "Downtown Englewood is experiencing a renaissance with hundreds of new residential units under construction and new businesses popping up throughout the district," said City Manager Shawn Lewis. "We will use this opportunity to better define the community's vision for CityCenter in order to create jobs, attract new residents, and enhance cultural attractions that everyone can enjoy."



Homeless and Mental Health Assistance Programs Underway

AllHealth Network has launched a pilot program with the Englewood Police Department to respond to non-emergency mental health calls by dispatching a Mobile Response Unit van staffed by a registered nurse and a behavioral health case manager. The program frees up police and sends professionals to de-escalate situations involving welfare checks, substance use, homelessness concerns, thoughts of self-harm and more. The team

can provide essential items, transportation to a care facility or transit hub, and outreach to local support organizations. To request assistance for someone in need, call the police non-emergency number at 303.761.7410 or 911. Higher level mental health concerns will continue to be addressed by AllHealth Network's Co-Responder Program launched in 2018 with the Englewood Police Department.

New Sidewalk Ordinance

The Englewood City Council recently passed restrictions to keep public sidewalks free of obstructions. As of November 5, no person can sit on, lie across or place their personal property on any place used for the passage of persons or vehicles, including streets, sidewalks and stairs. People may sit

or lie on public furniture, private property or other public areas that are not used for the passage of persons or vehicles. Contact communications@englewoodco.gov with questions. To report a violation, call the Englewood Police Department's non-emergency number at 303.761.7410.

\$7.3 Million Grant Awarded to Complete Streets Project on Old Hampden

The City of Englewood, with assistance from the EDDA, recently won a major grant from the Denver Regional Council of Governments to make Old Hampden safer and easier to get around for everyone. Detailed planning and construction will happen over the next two years. Improvements include safer crosswalks, a wide multi-purpose sidewalk, pedestrian light poles, street furniture and landscaping.
