
The Transformation of CityCenter Starts Now

Englewood's CityCenter is waiting for its big makeover. The city is working with major property owner LNR Partners to redevelop several existing buildings as part of a higher density, transit-oriented neighborhood village plan. In the in between, nonprofit gems RedLine Contemporary Art Center, Historic Englewood and The Guild will occupy once-empty storefronts to encourage foot traffic, creative activity and community reengagement. Englewood Water Project Coming Down the Pipe



The City of Englewood is implementing ambitious capital projects to improve water aesthetics over the next five years. Most of our water travels from Chatfield Reservoir to the Allen Water Treatment Plant over a system that dates back 150 years. While Englewood's water meets regulations, its source can affect the taste, odor and hardness. Without instituting new fees, the city is planning to add new and improved pipes along the City Ditch channel to improve drinkability and reliability.
