NAVIGATING THE FUTURE

Wayfinding and Placemaking in Englewood

Wayfinding is a strategy that is set in place to connect people to places of interest by guiding them through their physical environment. Wayfinding can enhance the overall experience of a place, support a branding or identity of a place and provide a sense of inclusion.

Englewood set out to create a comprehensive and effective plan for urban wayfinding signage throughout the City of Englewood in 2020 and 2021. The resulting plan provides a framework for prioritization and installation of new gateway signs, vehicular directional signs, pedestrian directional signs and interpretive signage. In addition to the wayfinding signage recommendations, the plan also provides placemaking opportunities and ideas for implementation at an economically viable scale throughout the city.

The final design concept identified in the plan is entitled “The Wooded Nook,” inspired by the definition of the word Englewood – a wooded nook. This concept is rooted in the city’s western, industrial and manufacturing history. It is brought to life with artistic and unique elements that celebrate the city’s present.

This concept uses stylized shapes that reference tree trunks, branches, leaves, grasses, flowers, vines and other natural elements found throughout the city. Earlier this year, the city contracted with Englewood’s Boyd Sign Systems to manufacture and install new “secondary” gateway signs (pictured left).

The signs greet motorists and pedestrians with a welcoming message as they enter the city limits.

Colorful and festive “primary” gateway monuments (pictured above), manufactured by Englewood’s Royal Signs, are slated to be installed this fall.

The city contracted with local artist Sean Doherty, whose whimsical metal flowers can be seen in downtown flowerpots, to create seasonal artwork that will be changed three times a year.

Finally, the city will soon implement community message signs, manufactured by Englewood’s Harmonic Media. Inspired by the “The Wooded Nook” theme, these signs will feature cabinets with changeable messaging, allowing the city to reach a greater audience.

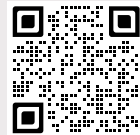

CONNECTING NEIGHBORS

Through Snow Buddies

As a senior living in a house with a long walkway, Barb Drake knows it would be difficult for her to shovel snow during the winter months.

“It’s really a struggle,” she said. “When the snow gets heavy, it’s hard for me to get out there and get it done.”

But when she found out about the city’s Snow Buddies program, that struggle was relieved. The Englewood volunteer program connects those who need snow removal assistance with volunteers willing to help. The city requires that snow and ice be removed from all sidewalks within 24 hours after the snow stops falling, and this program helps those who can’t physically shovel their walkway, and who don’t otherwise have assistance, get it cleared – keeping their walkways not only in compliance but safe for them to use.

Last year, nearly 40 matches were created, pairing volunteers with nearby neighbors who requested assistance. Yet the need has always outweighed the help, and program coordinators are hoping more volunteers will sign up.

For Drake, she was matched with her neighbor Max Pirrie, who lives just a couple doors down. Now, when a storm hits, she can rely on Pirrie to clear her pathways. It’s a helping hand, and he’s happy to lend.

“I feel glad I can help Barb,” Pirrie said. “I enjoy it because I can have a relationship with her that I never would have before.”

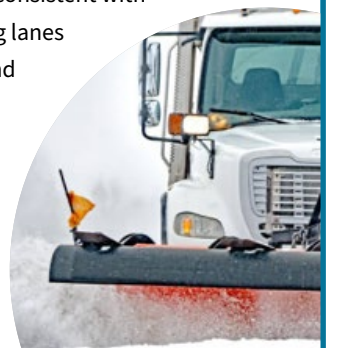

UPDATED CITY SNOW PLAN

At an August study session, Englewood Public Works staff worked with city council to update the snow plan for 2023-2024. The proposed plan, consistent with last year’s plan, will plow driving lanes on main thoroughfare streets and streets adjacent to schools and hospitals during each storm event. New this year, residential streets will be plowed with one pass down the middle after a 4” or greater snow event once the snow stops falling.

In 2022, the Englewood Police Department (EPD) began the process of applying to the Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP) for re-accreditation. The CACP accreditation is for a five-year period, and EPD's accreditation was set to expire in 2023. The accreditation process examined the department from top to bottom, including policies and procedures, policing programs, resource allocation, service delivery to the community, staffing/hiring/retention programs, property and evidence, the facility itself, and a host of other categories in place at the department to ensure Englewood citizens are receiving legitimate, professional and contemporary police services. In August 2023, CACP determined the

Englewood Police Department has continued to meet the high professional standards as set by the association and awarded re-accreditation for 2023-2027.

In February 2023, the police department took the International Association of Chiefs of Police One Mind Campaign pledge. This pledge was developed to challenge law enforcement agencies across the globe seeking to ensure successful interactions between law enforcement and individuals in crisis or suffering from mental health conditions. Completing the pledge necessitates that the department implement four practices: partnering with a local mental health organization, having policies in place addressing law enforcement response to individuals in crisis or experiencing mental health conditions, training 100% of the sworn officers on Mental Health First Aid, and having at least 20% of all sworn officers specially trained in Crisis Response Training (CIT). The EPD had three out of the four practices already in place and trained 100% of all officers in Mental Health First Aid this year. EPD already had 42% of the sworn officers CIT trained. In August, EPD became one of only nine law enforcement agencies in Colorado to complete the pledge.

The police department is working with Flock Safety to deploy numerous Flock cameras throughout the city. These cameras take photos of the rear of every vehicle that passes a camera during the day. The Flock Safety system only stores the license plates and vehicle descriptions for 30 days before it is purged. This information can be used proactively to locate stolen vehicles, people with warrants and vehicles of interest. The information can be used reactively to locate suspects in crimes that occur in the vicinity of these cameras or as an investigative tool to locate vehicles involved in criminal activity in other areas of the city or surrounding area. Communities utilizing this technology have typically seen a decrease in property crime, specifically motor vehicle theft.

I'd like to thank the Englewood Police Department for the dedicated service they bring to the community each day. I'm looking forward to the innovative new ideas they bring to Englewood City Council to protect and serve us all more effectively.

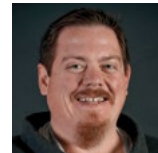


South Broadway, 1965

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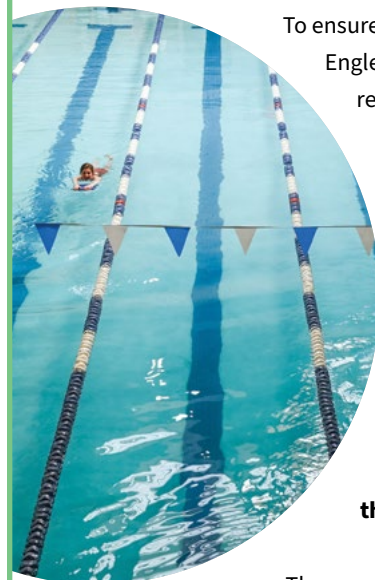

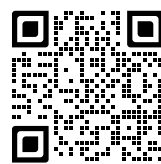

ENGLEWOOD SCHOOLS is on the forefront of preparing students for their futures in STEAM

Englewood Schools is intentionally aligning pre-kindergarten through 8th grade Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math (STEAM) classes to specific Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathways available to high school students. Those pathways include:

- Biomedical Sciences
- Computer Science
- Digital Media
- Engineering, Manufacturing and Design
- SAGE (Sustainable Agriculture and Green Energy)
- Visual and Performing Arts

Englewood Schools' students have multiple opportunities to experience what those CTE pathways are like by taking field trips to high schools. For example, 6th grade students participated in a cow eyeball dissection for firsthand exposure to the Biomedical Science Pathway. Middle school students attended a Career Pathway Summer Program that allowed them to explore the robust CTE programs

through hands-on learning experiences.

Another example is high school students working with elementary students to create 3D models through Computer Aided Design.

Students begin learning how to code as early as kindergarten. Opportunities like this positively impact students by helping them to envision themselves working in a STEAM field.

The instruction of STEAM and CTE at an early age sets up students for success when they reach high school. The classes introduce students to relevant technical content and skills needed in today's workforce. MORE FUNDING PAVES THE WAY for Improved Street Maintenance

With 123 centerline miles of streets in Englewood, it no doubt takes a lot of work (and funding) to keep them maintained and ready for a smooth ride. Until recently, Englewood roads weren't in the best condition. In a 2021 study, the city's road conditions were found to have a grade of D.

But thanks to Englewood voters, as well as additional federal government funding, the city is able to repave, maintain and improve its streets better than ever before. As part of the new work underway, the priority is set on improving the streets people use the most, including South Broadway and Dartmouth Avenue.



The new funding was made possible thanks to the 2022 voter-approved sales tax increase, which allocates an extra \$2 million each year specifically to the repaving, maintenance and improvement of Englewood streets and roads. The city also received one-time ARPA funding, also known as the American Rescue Plan Act, which city council allocated \$2 million toward street maintenance. All in all, funding has increased 40% since 2021. Use of the funds will have an impact for just about everyone driving in the city.

Plans include:

Crack seals of 227 blocks of roadways (126 more blocks than in 2022) to apply a rubberized tar mixture into cracks to prevent water from seeping into the base of the roadway.

Slurry seals on 68 blocks this year (43 more blocks than 2022) to seal the surface of roadways.

Mill and overlaying 60 blocks (30 more blocks than in 2022) using equipment to grind down the surface before applying new asphalt - in turn creating what feels like a new road.

Drivers are already seeing this work underway on two main thoroughfares, South Broadway and Dartmouth Avenue west of Santa Fe - projects that should be completed by the end of this fall.

"We wanted to be thoughtful and put the funding toward the busiest roads in the worst shape," said Tim Hoos, Deputy Director of Engineering and Asset Management. **"We want to get the busier roads done in order to benefit the most people."**

New Drainage Detention Pond Project Underway to Ease Flooding Risks

When a significant rainstorm hits, Englewood will be more prepared than ever thanks to a new project aimed at better controlling stormwater drainage. And it starts with creating space for a new stormwater storage pond.

The South Englewood Flood Reduction Project is kicking off with the main focus on creating a detention pond, along with piping in and out of it, at a property located in the 4300 block of South Windermere Street.

“In a high rain event, we need a way to contain excess flows,” said Tim Hoos, Englewood’s Deputy Director of Public Works for Engineering and Asset Management. “Creating the storage pond will allow us to release excess stormwater flows in a way the city’s existing downstream storm drain pipe system can handle.”

The new regional detention pond will be the third in the city and will work downstream of the existing detention pond at Rotolo Park. When rain falls, the water will be able to move through the

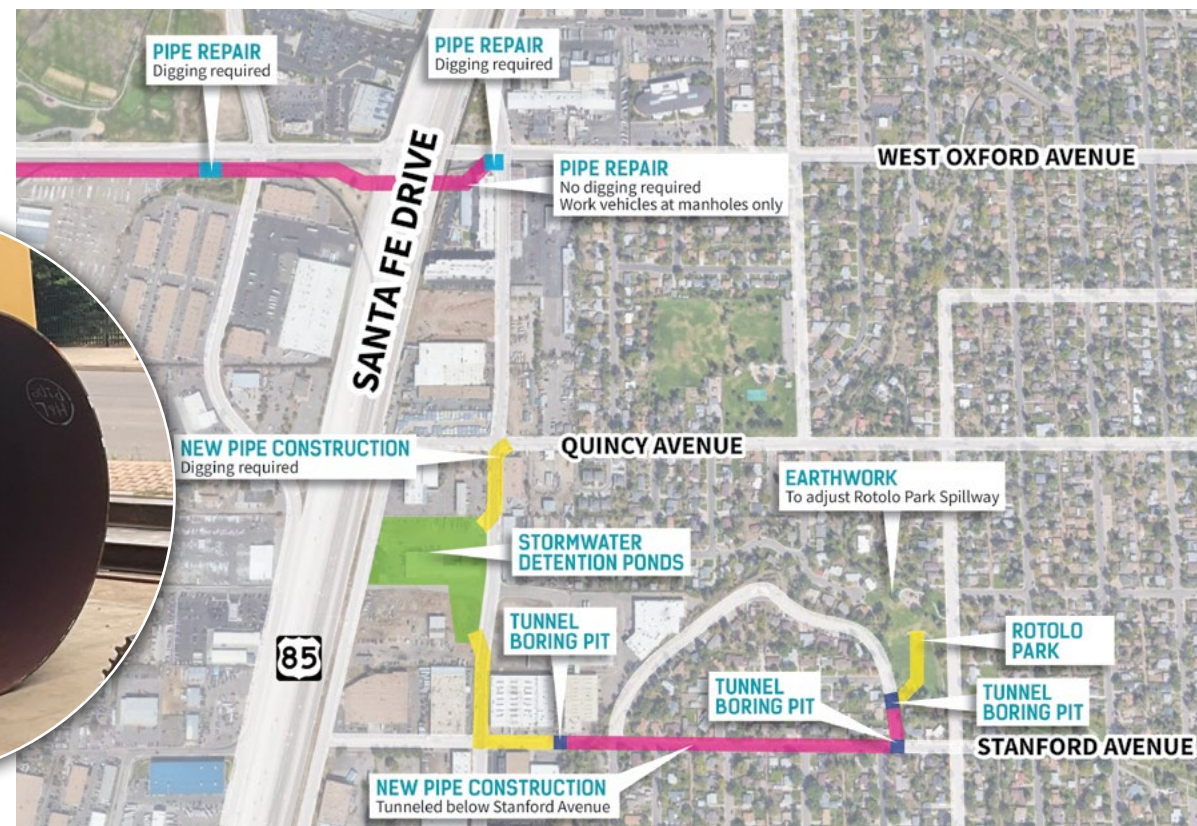
South Englewood drainage basin and be temporarily stored in the new pond. The water can then be released in a way that won’t overwhelm the downstream storm drain pipe system.



The South Englewood Flood Reduction Project is part of the city’s goal to better plan for significant rainfall and mitigate flooding. This plan was already in the works when a torrential rainstorm hit in June 2023, which destroyed a section of the storm drain pipe along Oxford Avenue – and underscored the need to better manage stormwater in the city’s South Englewood drainage basin.

In addition to the detention pond, the space will serve as a recreational park during dry times of the year.

The project is made possible through the Storm Water Drainage Fund, which Englewood residents support each month as part of their utility bill. Construction is scheduled to break ground by the end of 2023, and the project should be completed by the end of 2024.

Do you have jars of leftover grease from the holidays or automotive oil stored in your garage? Rather than pouring used grease or car oil down the drain, dispose of them safely for free at the annual Grease and Oil Takeback!

Residents of Englewood, Littleton and 19 connecting sanitation districts are invited to drop off up to 10 gallons of oil and grease per household.

Disposal Prep:

- Cooking oil and automotive oil must be separated into different containers and be free of contaminants such as fuels, solvents or water.
- Cooking oil should be liquid and free of food debris.
- Oil filters, antifreeze or oil from commercial businesses will not be accepted.

Introducing Englewood Utilities Lead Reduction Program



Englewood Utilities is dedicated to delivering safe drinking water to its valued customers – and the new Englewood Utilities Lead Reduction Program is a vital initiative aimed at further improving the safety of your drinking water.

Why Lead Matters

Lead is a toxic heavy metal that can leach into drinking water from lead pipes and plumbing fixtures, which can pose potential health risks. Currently, the lead level in drinking water does not require immediate action; however, Englewood Utilities is taking a proactive approach through the Lead Reduction Program.

Lead Reduction Program

To address potential health concerns, Englewood Utilities is taking steps to eliminate all lead service lines from the city's water

system. This multi-year program will replace lead service lines with copper lines, as funding is available. Here's what you can expect:

- Lead service line replacements will begin in the first half of 2024.
- Access to a continually updated service-line-inventory map to check your service line material at: englewoodco.gov/lead-reduction-program.
- Complimentary water pitchers and filters for customers to use for six months after a lead line replacement.
- Regular program updates, outreach efforts and educational resources from Englewood Utilities.

Your Role in Ensuring Safe Water

While we work diligently to replace lead service lines, customers can play a part too. If you suspect lead plumbing in your home, consider having it tested and replaced by a qualified professional.

Englewood Utilities' Lead Reduction Program reflects our commitment to your health and well-being. Together, we can ensure that every drop from your tap is clean, safe and lead-free.



Water Main Replacement Program

In 2023 and as a part of the annual water main replacement program, Englewood Utilities eliminated dead-ends and installed new fire hydrants for flushing at four locations within the distribution system to improve water quality and fire flow deficiencies. Approximately 1,900 linear feet of pipe were replaced. Utilities staff are working with an engineering consultant to develop replacement plans for 2024 and 2025 construction, which is anticipated to be approximately 6,700 feet in length total.

A day on patrol is never the same for Englewood Police Department (EPD) officers.

Sergeant Sheley shares a behind-the-scenes look at how the EPD operates in the city.

Q What does a typical day look like for a patrol officer?

Calls fluctuate every day. Often, officers run from call to call that differ from disputes to traffic accidents and then more critical calls such as assaults or robberies.

The EPD also utilizes alternate policing programs to try to effectively solve problems including Restorative Justice, Mobile Response Unit, Co-Responders, Call Diversion and Zone Policing. These resources help relieve call loads for patrol and support the community's needs while still providing a high level of service to the City of Englewood.

Q What is the difference between a ticket and an arrest?

The difference between a ticket and a custodial arrest depends on the call. Just because an officer puts someone in handcuffs does not mean they are necessarily going to be held in a jail. Many times, individuals are released with a ticket, which is a promise to appear in court. Tickets are typically issued for municipal ordinance violations and misdemeanor offenses. A custodial arrest is made when an individual commits a more serious crime, often resulting in being detained in a jail.

Q What are the main crimes you see?

It changes from day to day, shift to shift, and during the different seasons. EPD sees more calls for service during the summer as more people are out and about enjoying the weather. Preventable crimes are a common problem, and the Englewood Police Department reminds everyone to lock their vehicles and report suspicious behavior.

The City of Englewood continues to invest in its water and sewer systems to improve the level of service to Englewood customers. Taste, odor and hardness of drinking water are the top priorities, and a significant amount of money is being invested in capital projects to address these concerns, such as the City Ditch Piping Project. On the sewer side, capital investments at South Platte Renew (the wastewater treatment facility co-owned by Englewood and Littleton) are aimed at replacing aging infrastructure and meeting treatment regulations.

The city is continuing its path to investing nearly \$200 million in the water and sewer systems over the next several years. As part of the way to fund this investment, it's necessary to continue annual increases to the water and sewer rates. In 2024, both water and sewer rates are anticipated to increase by 4.5%. The Capital Improvement Fee – which addresses water taste, odor and hardness issues, as well as repairs and replacement of the aging water system – will not increase in 2024, as this every-other-year increase was last adjusted in 2023.

These increases are consistent with the long-term financial planning the city has developed over the last three years to address aging infrastructure. The typical Englewood residential customer using approximately 6,000 gallons per month will see an increase in their water and sewer bill around \$2.12 per month in 2024. While these rate increases are necessary each year for improvements to the water and sewer systems, Englewood continues to have among the lowest water and sewer rates in the region.

ENGLEWOOD POLICE DEPARTMENT

Englewood Police Department officers checked into Colorado’s Finest High School of Choice Salon and Spa Academy to support the students’ training for haircuts, facial waxing as well as beard trims.

During the first week of school, Englewood Fire Marshal’s Office participated in Englewood Schools fire drills and handed out coloring books, pencils and activity books to all kindergartners and first graders.

In August 2023, the Colorado Association of Chiefs of Police determined that the Englewood Police Department (EPD) has continued to meet the **high professional standards** as set by the association and awarded EPD re-accreditation for 2023-2027.



UTILITIES

As of September 1, **56 valves** in the city’s distribution system have been replaced. This program brings the city one step closer to ensuring an even more efficient and reliable water supply for our community.



EVENTS

Englewood summer signature events were a hit! **Thousands of people** attended the SunSET Concert Series, Silent Disco, Water Festival, 4th of July, Englewood Markets and Englewood Block Party.



ENGLEWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY

The library’s summer reading program wrapped up in August. There were more than **3,650 participants** between summer reading and summer programs, including 136 programs for babies, youth, tweens and teens.

During the summer reading program, library participants helped with several service projects benefiting the community.

Kids colored pencil bags and filled them with essential school supplies for local classrooms. Also, the library collected more than 400 food and school supply items over the summer. These items were delivered to the Englewood School Family Resource Center to help support Englewood families.

Potential 2024 Parks and Recreation Bond to Benefit All

Through a community-wide input process in 2017, the Parks and Recreation Master Plan was created to highlight a variety of needs that should be addressed throughout Englewood’s parks and recreation system. After being updated to include the most relevant needs, city council is now considering a bond measure for November 2024, that would provide the ability to update these areas and amenities – and there’s something every Englewood resident can look forward to.

The city initially considered the ballot measure for November 2023, but according to the city charter, general obligation elections must be the only question on a city special election ballot and must be on a state-wide election ballot to comply with the Taxpayers Bill of Rights (TABOR). This means Englewood is now considering the bond for the November 2024 ballot. The potential bond – which is being considered for up to \$50 million – would include updates to the city’s parks and recreation systems to improve sustainability. Water reduction, water saving technology implementation and transforming turf into native plant landscapes are just some of the potential improvements that would benefit Englewood long into the future.



“It’s for everyone,” said Christina Underhill, Englewood Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf Director, noting what would be possible through the potential bond. “Every age can utilize these improvements and enjoy them.”

The bond would also address accessibility concerns with updates to allow all residents to enjoy playgrounds, pathways, pavilions and more within Englewood’s parks and recreation facilities. Given the rise in residency near Cushing Park, city officials are also hoping to add an off-leash dog area to the park.

Updates to make the city even more fun are also being considered, from a surf simulator to ninja-cross system and water tube slides to added event spaces, splash pad and more.

Currently, residents pay \$84 per year for a recreation bond passed in the early 2000s. This bond sunsets at the end of 2023. The new bond initiative is estimated that a resident with a home valued at \$500,000 would pay a total of \$150 per year or an additional \$66 per year from the former bond.

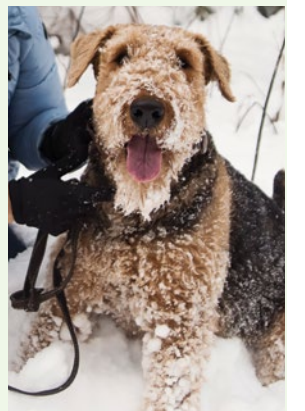

SWIMMING LESSONS



Infant and Toddler

Babes & Tots (6 mos – 3 yrs)

Introduction to the water with a focus on safety and primary water skills including submersion, bubbles, and water play with parents in a fun, family environment.

Level 0.5: Tadpoles (2½ – 3½ yrs)

For our youngest students, gaining more independence and confidence in the water. We will introduce floating, but comfort is our goal!

Preschool

Level A1: Guppies (3 - 5 yrs)

To join Level A1 Guppies, kids must be comfortable in the water on their own. To graduate from this class, they will need to be able to float on their own.

Level A2: Clownfish (3 - 5 yrs)

To join Level A2: Clownfish, kids must be comfortable floating on their own, with their face in the water. To graduate from this class, they will need to be able to roll on their back to breath.

Level A3: Pufferfish (3 - 5 yrs)

To join Level A3: Pufferfish, kids must be comfortable rolling on their own. To graduate from this class, they need to be able to swim independently across the tot pool.

Level A4: Sunfish (3 - 5 yrs)

To join Level A4: Sunfish, kids must be swimming independently across the tot pool with rolls to breath. This is the highest-level class for this age group. We will begin to introduce deep end skills and arms with kicking.

School Age

Level B1: Stingray (6 - 14 yrs)

School Age, Level B1: Stingray, introduces basic swimming skills like floating on front and back. To graduate, kids must be comfortable putting their face in the water and rolling on their own.

Level B2: Dolphin (6 - 14 yrs)

School Age Level B2: Dolphins must be able to roll onto their back and go underwater. To graduate, kids must be able to swim 15 meters, comfortably rolling on their back to breathe.

Level B3: Orca (6 - 14 yrs)

School Age Level A3: Orcas must be able to swim 15 meters, comfortably rolling to breathe. To graduate, kids must be able to swim 25 meters front and back, and perform basic freestyle, with side breathing, and backstroke for 15 meters.

Level B4: Shark (6 - 14 yrs)

School Age Level B4: Sharks must be able to swim 25 meters front and back, with basic freestyle, with side breathing, and Backstroke skills for 15 meters. To graduate, kids must be able to swim 50 meters front and back, with basic knowledge of breaststroke and butterfly kicks for 15 meters. This is the highest level, but if your kid would like a challenge, we offer a Swim Team.

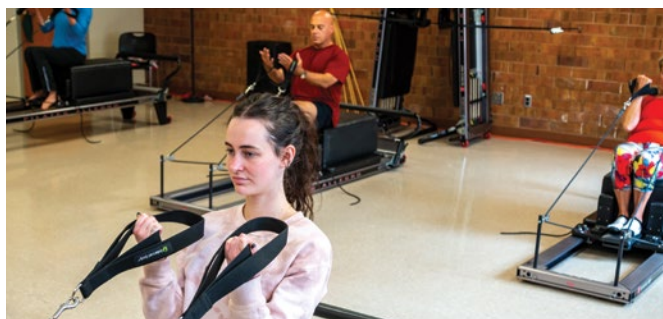
