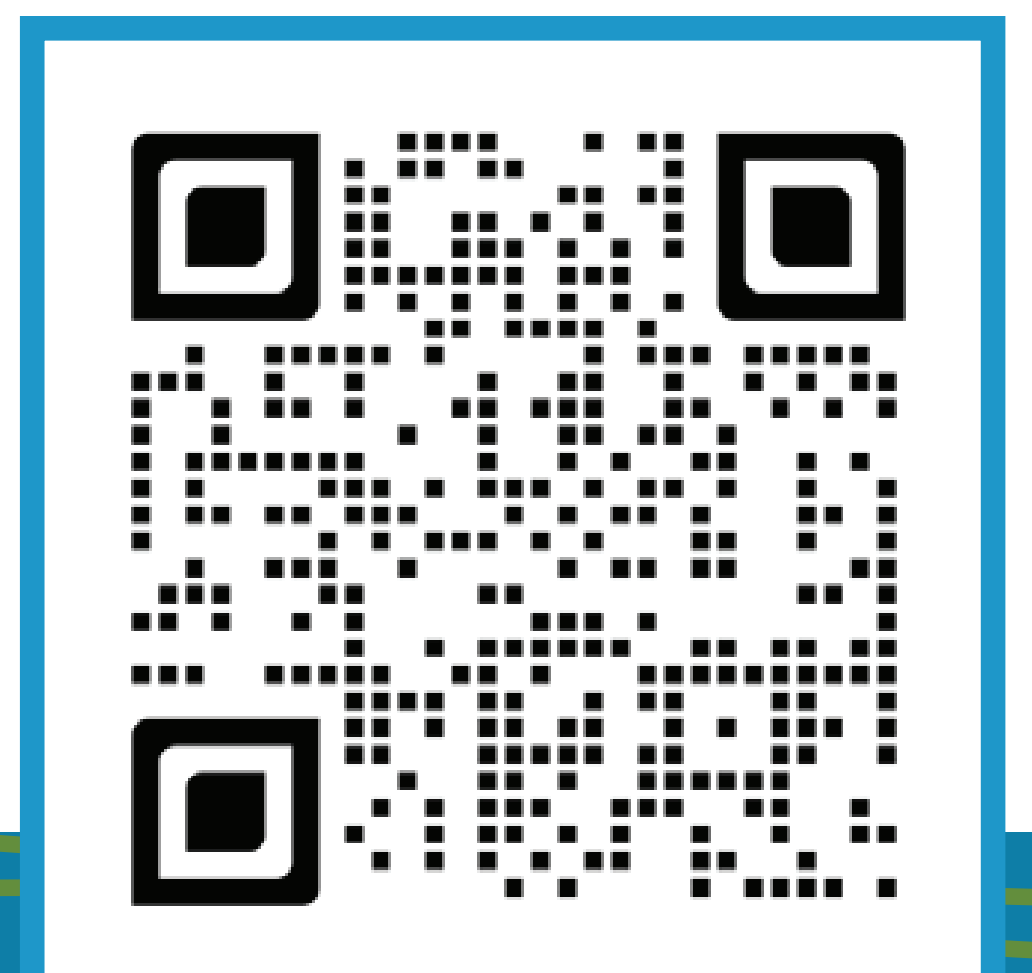

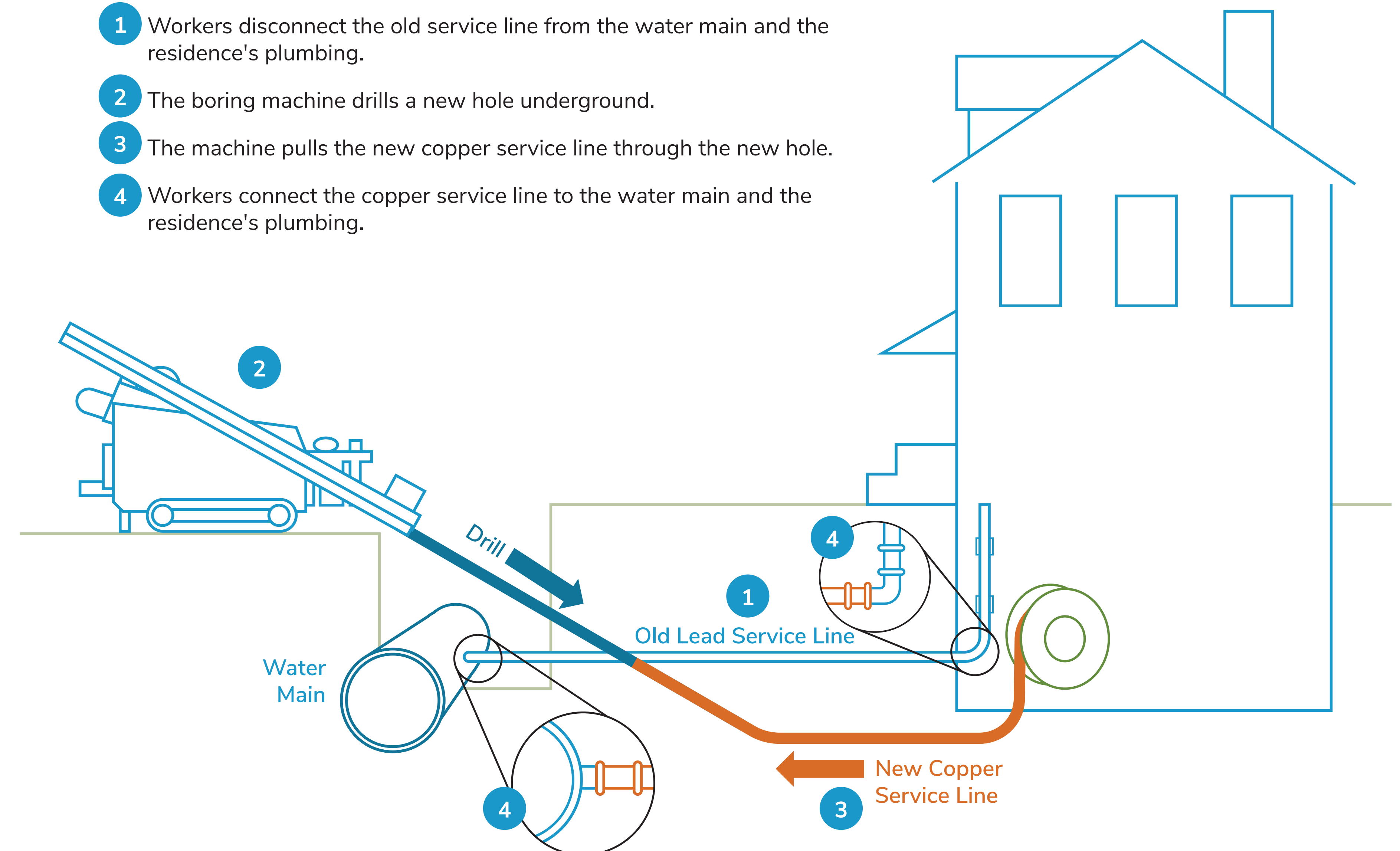
What should you expect?

Englewood Utilities Lead Reduction Program Benefits

- **Remove Lead in Drinking Water:** Englewood Utilities is taking significant steps to eliminate lead water service lines from the community.
- **Protect Public Health:** Exposure to lead can cause serious health problems whether from drinking water or other sources.
- **Thoughtful Construction:** Lead service line replacement will be planned on a neighborhood by neighborhood basis and will consider: those most at risk including children under the age of 5, high concentrations of lead service lines, and ongoing city projects.
- **Keep You Informed:** Englewood Utilities will provide program updates, conduct community outreach, and education activities throughout the Lead Reduction Program.

Lead Service Line Replacement Process

- 1 Workers disconnect the old service line from the water main and the residence's plumbing.
- 2 The boring machine drills a new hole underground.
- 3 The machine pulls the new copper service line through the new hole.
- 4 Workers connect the copper service line to the water main and the residence's plumbing.

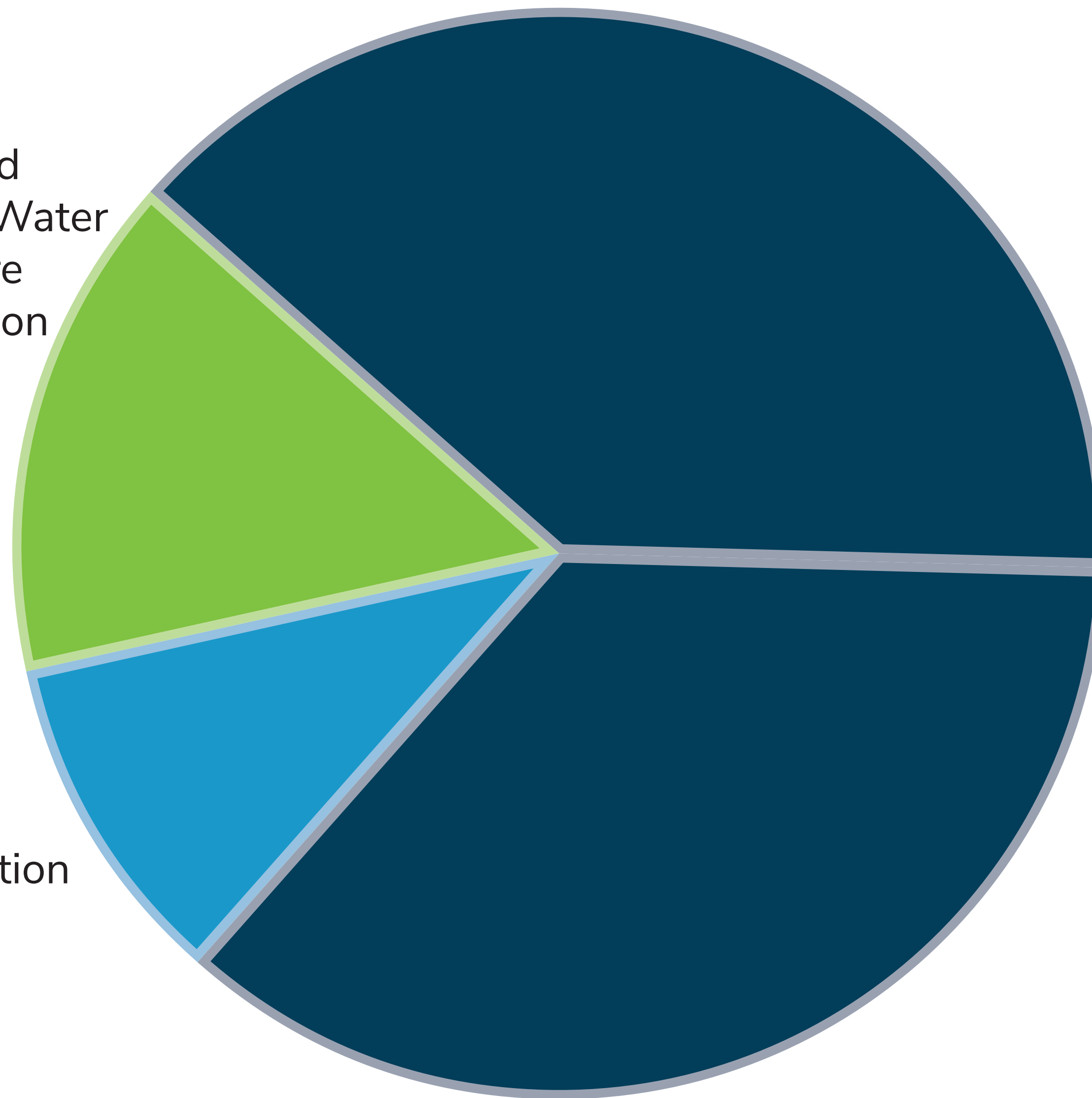




Financial Considerations

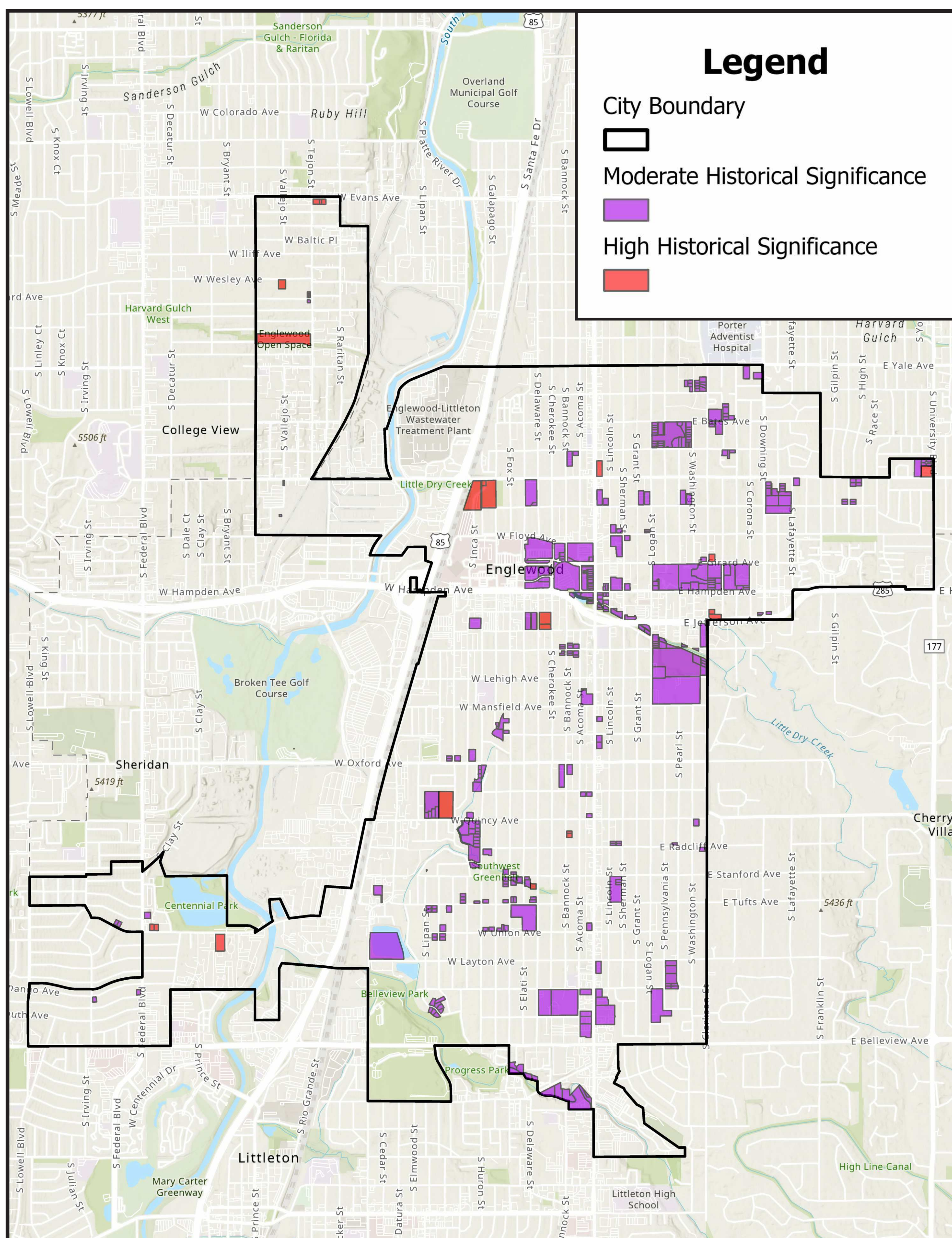
What does this mean for you?

Englewood Utilities anticipates a rate or fee increase to support program financing. These increases will be adopted annually as approved by City Council with opportunities for public comment.



Environmental and Historical Considerations

- The City of Englewood Utilities underwent the National Environmental Protection Act review process and found that the Lead Reduction Program had No Impact or No Adverse Impact on the environment.
- Coordination with Colorado State Historic Preservation Office identified no effect to historic properties.
- The Lead Reduction Program will monitor any construction activities at properties of moderate or high historical significance as shown in this map.

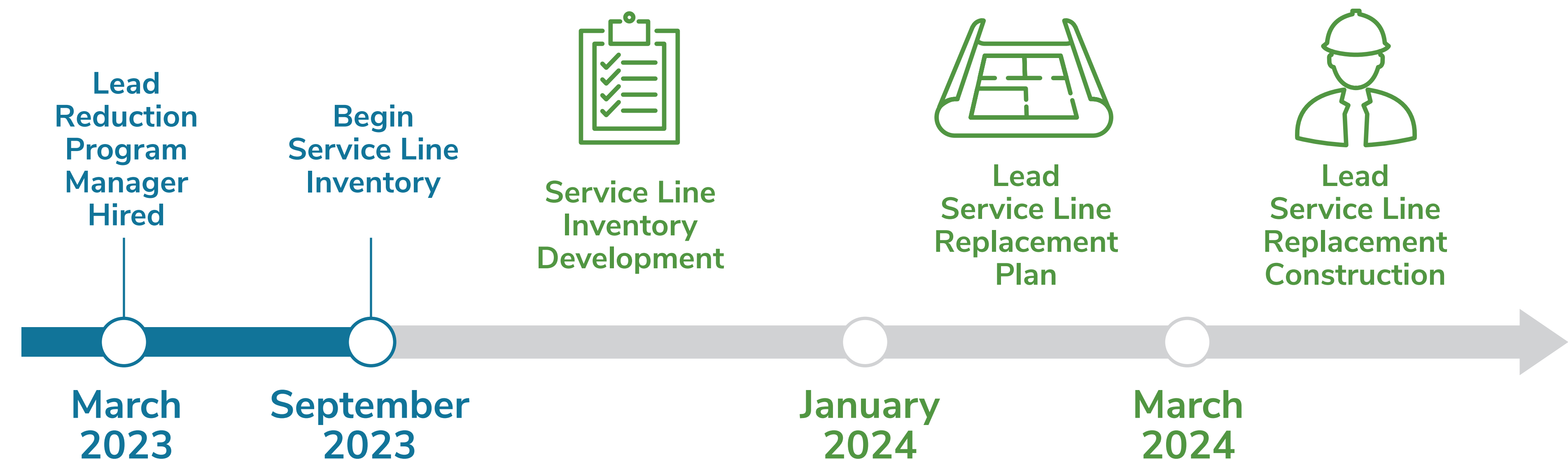




Program Information

Program Elements:

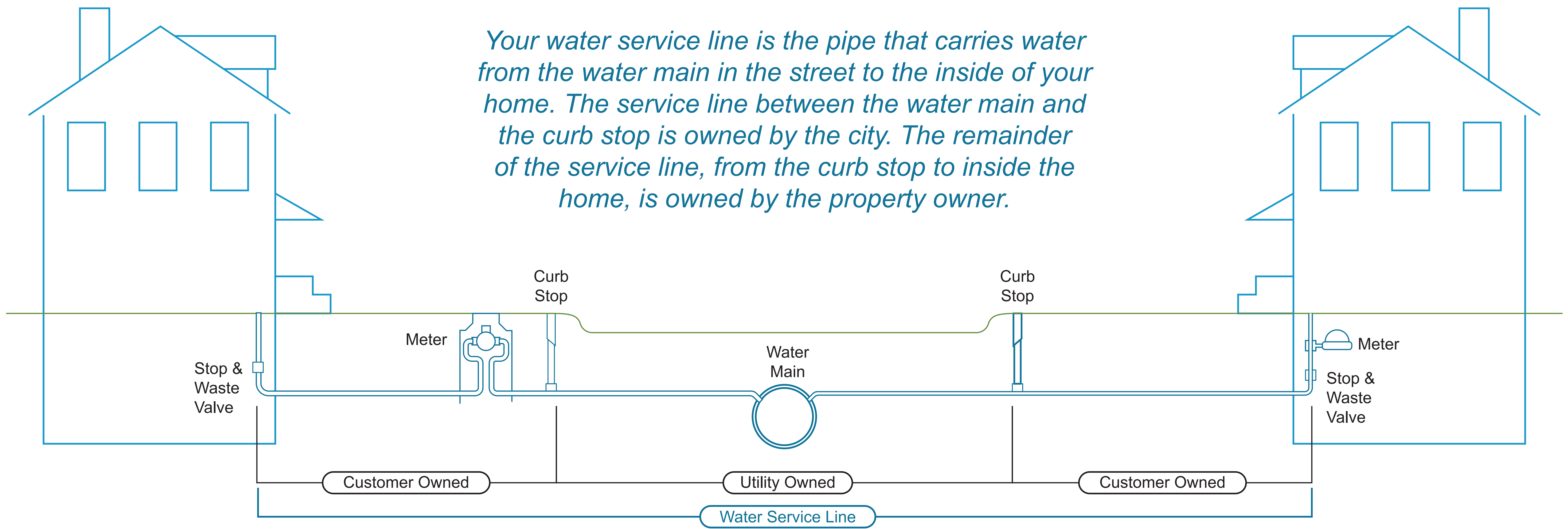
- Systematically replace all lead service lines in our service area with copper lines. Lead service line replacements are scheduled to begin in the first half of 2024 and it will take multiple years to remove all lead service lines.
- Develop and maintain a publicly accessible service line inventory map of all service lines in Englewood's service area.
- Provide a free water pitcher and filter for customers to use for six months after a replacement.
- Continue to provide program updates, outreach, and education.





What is a Water Service Line?

Your water service line is the pipe that carries water from the water main in the street to the inside of your home. The service line between the water main and the curb stop is owned by the city. The remainder of the service line, from the curb stop to inside the home, is owned by the property owner.
