- Strategic Plan- Working with the Leadership Team and staff from across city departments, the City Manager's Office finished updating the city's strategic plan, based on guidance provided by Council at the annual retreat on January 27th. Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf

- The Broken Tee Front 9 and Par 3 course opened on February 14th. All 18 holes opened February 15th. The conditions are wet, and no handicap placards will be allowed for carts. With the weather changing, the golf course may not be open on Saturday but could open on Sunday.
- New tee marker colors have been selected for Broken Tee. The markers and design are being done in-house. Tee Suggestions based on handicap and distance hit with a 7 iron have been determined. The new scorecard design has been approved and is with the vendor to print.
- The remaining 5 caissons have been dug and poured for the solar lights at Belleview Park. The lights will be installed next week once the concrete cures.



o The charging stations for the new Belleview Train arrived and the electrician is in the process of the installation.



 The Wellness Insurance Programs (WIP) reimbursements for 2023 were \$132,204 (Tivity & Healthy Contributions) This is \$12,000 more than last year. Includes Recreation and Malley Centers. On Valentine's Day, Malley Recreation Center showed their love for the Nuggets by attending the game vs. the Sacramento Kings. 

- The library did outreach on Thursday at Clayton and Charles Hay Elementary Schools. Kimberely was quite popular with the students, even dressed as a skunk.








Police


