The City of Englewood is excited to launch the Englewood Trolley Refresh and Ridership survey. In the coming year, the city will be



Amazing things are happening in Englewood

- Repairs and painting of the bridges over the lazy river at Pirates Cove have been completed.
- 4,658 riders accessed the Englewood Trolley service in February.

- Englewood Recreation
 Center renovation is progressing with the painting of the front column. The lobby restroom demolition is next.
- The public works streets crew was out hot mix patching on Old Hampden Avenue, Dartmouth Avenue and Shoshone Street. Due to higher traffic volumes and speeds on these roads, the crew generally started repairs around 4 a.m. each day.
- The Englewood Police Department hosted a women's personal safety class where officers shared tips on how to stay safe and how to defend yourself should the need arise.
