

Public Works

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Update:
 - Site A: The project achieved substantial completion and Oxford was reopened to traffic on Wednesday this week. The contractor still has some work inside the pipe. The work includes applying the same geopolymer we installed at the downstream end of the project at the intersection of Oxford and Navajo. This work is not going to take place until late May or June and will last about 5 days. There will be some lane closures at the intersection at that time.
 - Site B: The sanitary and storm work at Quincy is scheduled to wrap up in early May with paving to immediately follow. Excavation continues at the ponds and waterline work on Stanford east of Navajo is slated to commence in the coming days.
- Landscaping around the Civic Center loop, on the north side of the building, is being replaced with removal of the old landscaping underway this week.
 New landscaping is slated to be installed in the next 1-2 weeks.

South Platte Renew

- On Wednesday, April 17th, the Outreach team from South Platte Renew (SPR) participated in Coronado Elementary School's Annual Science Fair. The SPR booth showcased a "What not to flush" exhibit, emphasizing items that should never be flushed down the toilet. Additionally, SPR staff engaged the students with an interactive quiz to educate them on water conservation and best practices. This marks SPR's third consecutive year of involvement in this event.
- Also on Wednesday, Jamie Safulko, SPR's Deputy Director Engineering, contributed to a panel discussion at the Design-Build Institute of America's Water/Wastewater Conference. The panel, titled "Becoming an Owner of Choice in Today's Competitive Market," allowed Jamie to showcase SPR's collaborative approach with contractors in executing construction projects. This platform provided SPR with national exposure as a utility leader in the industry.
