




• Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf

- The Agronomy Team planted flowers in the flower bed around the clubhouse at Broken Tee.
- The Blue tee box on Hole 2 is closed for the next 2 weeks. The Agronomics Team seeded and top-dressed it with sand and compost. This should help with filling in the bare spots.



- The Parks crew planted flowers at Belleview, Duncan, Malley, and Pirates Cove. Flowers were also delivered to the volunteers to begin planting at Romans, Cushing/Cherokee, Janson, Rec. Center, and at Paseo.
- o Recreation Summer Camps: Kick off June 3rd. Campers first trip to Pirate's Cove Water Park starts the 4th. This week camp staff went through training as well as busily preparing the gyms at Colorado's Finest High School of Choice, where the camp is held. Currently, 91 different campers will be participating during different parts of the summer with a current average of 40 campers each week between the two age groups. We are lucky to have awesome staff who are excited to bring fun and adventure to a lot of Englewood youth. We are also being known as a great place to work over the summer as 7 of our staff are returning from last year and 3 are new to our program, which is a fantastic improvement over the last few years. Amongst the staff are college students studying education and psychology as well as a school para-educator and substitute teacher, each with varying experiences and knowledge of taking care of youth. We are still receiving calls from parents asking if we have space and currently have plenty of space for anyone wanting to join.

 The Farm and Train kicked off opening weekend with a bang! The new electric train was dedicated at 9am with some City Council and Parks and Recreation Commission (past and present) participating in the ribbon cutting. Over 4400 tickets were sold to visit the farm and ride the train!

Public Works

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Project Updates:
 - Site A (pipe lining): The work on Navajo has been completed and traffic control removed.
 - Site B (pond): The launch pit for the tunnel has been dug and secured. The tunneling sub (Northstar) is working to build the infrastructure they need before they can actually launch. The tunnel

boring machine (TBM) is not yet on its way. Staff completed the requirements with Denver Water to receive an easement that was needed to build the culvert connecting Ponds A and B. This effort took about 2 months but now we are ready to go! Ponds A and B are still being excavated. Some diesel contaminated soil was found within Pond B. The team is working to safely dispose of them as promptly as possible.

• South Platte Renew

 On May 30th, South Platte Renew (SPR) Public Outreach staff visited Primrose School in Littleton to conduct water education activities for 25 pre-kindergarten students. The children learned about clean water concepts while coloring SPR-themed decals, which were then applied to t-shirts they could take home.

Utilities
