- **Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf**
 - The library hosted the Authors Festival on Saturday, June 8th. Twenty authors were in attendance with over 100 participants. The morning session was meet and greet with authors and in the afternoon panel discussions were held.



- Volunteer Appreciation night was held at Pirates Cove on Wednesday evening. Just over 100 volunteers attended the event. Food was donated by Texas Roadhouse and Meadow Gold.
- Broken Tee held the second annual Women In Golf Day with 58 participants. The participants could select between a golf clinic with the

pros from Meta Golf or play a quick 6 holes. After the events concluded the women met for a happy hour, dinner and raffle prizes.





- On Wednesday, Celebrate Golf was held at Broken Tee with activities for kids and adults alike. A BBQ lunch was hosted at the River Run pavilion to help raise funds for the Englewood High School Golf team. Over 200 people attended the BBQ and participated in the activities.
- Parks irrigation update: Romans park irrigation has been repaired. The turf will be aerated once consistent moisture has been achieved and will bounce back in a few weeks. Northwest Greenbelt irrigation has replaced the up-pipe and 3" fittings. This was not an easy repair and staff was able to complete the work without contracting the work out. Cushing Park is still down. We continue to wait on the new motor and pump. A contractor will install and program the equipment once parts arrive. Estimate arrival is Monday. Staff will continue to water the contracted flower beds every other day or as needed.
- Swedish Hospital came to Lower Dry Creek Plaza with 30 volunteers. The group walked from the Plaza to Logan, picking up trash and debris.
- Parks is working with a contractor to repaint four pickleball courts and replace the nets at Colorado Finest.
- Englewood Recreation is running a youth Track & Field Program through CARA (Colorado Association of Recreational Athletics). There are 21 participants ages 9-14 who will compete in local track meets throughout the summer.
- This week Recreation Staff expressed our appreciation to the many guests who have been impacted by the renovation project since September 2023, with goodies and reusable shopping bags. The guests were just as excited to see us in the new space as we were to be there.



- The Englewood Malley Cats are ranked #1 in their division for the first half of the season with a record of 13-1.



- **Police**

- Englewood Police hosted Popsicles with the Police on May 30th and we had a great turn out. We had a great time enjoying the sunshine and showing everyone all our different Police vehicles.





- **Public Works**

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Update, Site B: A site visit to view the tunnel boring machine (TBM) was held this past Tuesday with staff from public works, communications, as well as MHFD, and council present – see photos below. Tunneling operations have commenced and the contractor is making good forward progress on the ponds.



- On Saturday afternoon June 8th, roadway damage was discovered at the intersection of Zuni and Dartmouth. Public Works, Utilities, and City County of Denver have been collaborating on the issue. A manhole and pipe within the City of Englewood city limits has been damaged and repairs / replacement are required. Public Works' on-call contractor arrived on site and began work Thursday June 13th. A timeframe for the completion of the repair is not known until the full extent of the damage is assessed. That said, current estimates are a few weeks. See photos below:





- Installation of a new sewer line along Inca, south of Hampden (285), is still in process. the installation is being done for a new private development and has resulted in the closure of the southbound lanes of Inca until the work is complete. The new sewer line is ~14' and adjacent to gas lines, which has slowed the contractor's progress. It's anticipated that work will be completed in the next 2-3 weeks. See photo below:

- South Platte Renew's (SPR) Annual Water Fest will take place on Thursday, June 20th, from 3-7 p.m. at the SPR facility. This free, family-friendly event invites the entire community to celebrate the importance of water. That being said, there has been pointed public comment about not wanting the Surf Simulator and it is a higher dollar item. I could see the removal of this being a way to get to a more palatable overall bond dollar amount and demonstrate to the public we have been listening.

I feel this is too in the weeds for us. I am comfortable with a \$40 or \$45M bond. If getting into the weeds, only thing I would say is the success of the river run and their surf simulator is reason for me to vote for this

Ward
 Cushing causes me heartburn because we already did massive improvements there. Knowing the Emerson Park neighborhood, the people who live there are likely to be VERY resistant to change, especially if that change brings new people to use that park. I've received very negative feedback on any proposed landscaping changes at Rotolo. Aside from the restroom, I'd leave that alone. I do not think the Southwest Greenbelt needs ANY of the suggested improvements. I live one block away from it and walk it regularly. The only changes I'd make there are improvements to existing paths for more consistent drainage and snow removal. There are several spots that ice over and puddle in the winter, making for dangerous conditions. I'm not sold on \$2.4 million for improvements to Centennial Park. The Parks Department must emphasize the need for irrigation improvements. This - like our water and sewer infrastructure citywide - has been neglected for years, and the People will not understand the need to spend \$2 million on it unless the messaging is clear and they have a firm understanding of why the current system is problematic. "Implement native plants in some of the neighborhood parks" is not a clear enough survey question for me to answer. I've received significant negative feedback on the current native plants plan, but I think there is some room for native planting in some of our parks.
