## • Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf

- Once again, a huge turnout for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July festivities at Belleview and Cornerstone Parks! Both parks were packed with happy attendees and the fireworks went off without a hitch! Thank you to parks, police, fire marshal, code enforcement, recreation staff for all the hard work putting this event on! #oneteam
- Malley VOA Lunch Volunteers Robin Garcia & Ruth Krueger work hard each week to feed patrons a nutritious lunch. Malley Volunteers are at the heart of Malley's service to the community.



 Pilates helps to improve flexibility, increase core muscle strength, and tone, and bring folks together at Malley! Classes are currently at capacity and patrons are getting stronger each class!



- Broken Tee Gross Revenues are up 19%, Range use is up 20%, Golf Cart Use is up 35%, Green Fees are up 65%, and Par 3 Green Fees are up 52% in revenues compared to last June! Championship Rounds are up 17% with 7224 rounds recorded, and Par 3 rounds are up 23% with 4562 recorded rounds!
- The new robotic mower has arrived at Broken Tee and is being tested at the practice area near the putting green.
- Parks staff set up and took down for the annual Jeremy Bitner event last Saturday. The event was a great success.
- The backflow preventer was stolen from the Rob Roy property. Staff
  has submitted the paperwork for reimbursement via insurance. Staff will
  replace the backflow next week.
- Parks staff was at Depot Prairie Park this week removing noxious weeds.
   Staff used a very limited number of herbicides along the path to kill/ limit weeds. Most of the weeds had to be removed by hand.
- Xcel will be replacing some of the park lights at Northwest in the coming weeks. Staff reviewed and approved their construction/site plan. All the lights will be converted to LED once the new poles are in place.
- Library summer programs are in full swing! From learning about the science of space to putting on plays and competing in the Olympic games,
   Englewood youth are reading, having fun and learning all summer long.
   Over 645 kids are registered in summer reading which is up 11% from this time last year. Sixteen programs are offered weekly and this last week over 495 attendees in these programs! Kudos to the library staff who are halfway through the summer reading program!
- Participants enjoy their weekly Seated Yoga class at the Englewood Recreation Center. A weekly virtual option is available for those who opt to take the class at home.





#### Public Works

• The stormwater crew recently completed a repair of a manhole, located at E Bates Ave and S. Corona St, to prevent a sinkhole from forming. A pavement failure was reported to the team and upon review, was the result of an old brick manhole that was failing. Streets division performed the pavement cut and backfill of the hole. The repair was complete the day after crews were notified. A true one-team group effort. See photos below.



 In addition, over the month of June the Stormwater team focused on and completed cleaning of the alley storm inlets located north of 285. Alley inlets north of 285 were the focus of the team to supplement the on-going inventory and condition assessment for the southern portion of the City.
