City Manager's Office

- Intergovernmental Agreements- Completed work on two IGAs, one with Arapahoe County for emergency services (Scheduled for the Council meeting on July 15) and one with the City of Littleton for a shared green business program (Scheduled for the Council meeting on July 22).
- Budget Review Committee- Participated in the first internal budget review committee with South Platte Renew and Utilities. Started in 2022, this internal process allows other departments, such as HR, IT, Finance, Communications, and the City Manager's Office, to conduct a review of proposed budget requests for efficiencies and redundancies and assist in developing the final budget proposal that goes to Council in August.

• Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf

- An Irrigation pump went down at Belleview Park. Pricing to replace the irrigation pump and motor came in just below \$20,000(This price does not include labor). The existing broken pump and motor has been rebuilt multiple times and has exceeded its lifespan. This pump is the last of three to be replaced. The pump and motor should be installed in 3 weeks. Staff will continue to water section 2 manually.
- Bates Logan Phase II renovations are scheduled to start August 1st. The
 contractor plans to mobilize and secure the job site. The goal is to keep a
 small footprint to not disturb the park too much like phase I. The new
 playground is scheduled to arrive and be installed in early October.
- The "new and improved" starter station at Broken Tee is up! There is a green tent with a table, chair, and fan for the staff in front of the hole 1 tee boxes. This position provides a more "hands-on" and personable approach for our patrons. The starter shares information about the course, checks the golfer's receipt, and pairs up players in golf carts when needed.



 $_{\odot}$ Acid injection is being used on the Broken Tee Front 9 irrigation system; this will help break down the salts a bicarbonate that exist more in the Front 9 irrigation system than the back 9.




The library hosted many great summer reading programs this week.


• Police

• Public Works

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Update: Site B The well located in Pond B was abandoned this week. Once this work is complete, ACC can remove the tank in the area and proceed with excavating in this part of the pond. Tunneling is underway. The main activity going on right now is the work to install the culvert that connects Ponds A and B. Once this culvert is installed, we will see the beginning of some concrete work in the ponds to form headwalls, wingwalls, a retaining wall and outlet structures.
- The Public Works Streets Team has completed the following year to date; repair /patching of 32 utility cuts, and over 843 labor hours working in the field including use of 109 tons of asphalt. See photos below:


