DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

- **Administration City Manager's Office**
 - Finance, CMO and internal service departments conducted five departmental Budget Review Committee hearings this week to review departmental budgets with the goal of understanding needs and identifying budget savings as the 2025 budget is developed.
 - The first of several community focus groups was conducted by City Manager Lewis this week mirroring the process he conducted five years ago to determine strengths, weaknesses and opportunities for the community. The two questions resident participants answer are, "What do you love about Englewood" and "If you had a magic wand, what would you change about Englewood." All Board & Commission members and alumni of the three citizen academies (Elevate, Planning School, Citizens Police) have been invited to participate.

- **Information Technology**
 - Cogsdale (Utility Billing) went live this week. There are still a few issues being worked through.
- **Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf**
 - Parks crews continue to hand water Belleview Park. The irrigation pump should be installed in a couple of weeks.
 - A number of shopping carts were removed by parks staff from various open space areas this past week.
 - Malley Friday Movie Time had 20 people watch “Mission Impossible, Dead Reckoning” Part 1 this week.

- 10 new doctors from Swedish Family Practice toured Malley this week. The practice sends patients to Malley to engage in the various activities that are offered.
- The library had another successful week of summer programs. Over 690 kids are registered, 15 programs have been offered with over 435 program attendees. This week the participants visited the arctic and created arctic fox and polar bear cookies. When Ms. Kimberly visited the KidConnection summer camp where the campers helped solve a Fairytale Whodunit! MadAboutHoops presented an amazing performance with hula hoops and then gave the participants a chance to try their hula hoop skills.







- Pirates Cove held a food drive July 18th – July 14th which brought in non-perishable food for a local food bank.
- A tree memorial program at Broken Tee is being created to allow loved ones to honor someone on the golf course by planting a tree at Broken Tee. Our first memorial tree will be planted next week, and the family will have a memorial here on July 28th.
A plaque will be showcased in the clubhouse.
- Wyatt's at Broken Tee offers live music and Prime Rib on Saturday nights and Trivia on Thursday evenings.
- This summer, the Recreation Day Camp has provided childcare for over 90 individuals aged 5-13. This week the campers felt a need for speed and visited Adventure Raceway.





- **Police**

- Officers were able to stop by a local lemonade stand to say hello to some amazing kiddos who made a special batch of cookies for us to bring back to the Police Department.



- **Public Works**

- South Englewood Flood Reduction – Site B Update: Last Friday there was a small soil collapse near the tunnel boring machine (TBM) and city ditch. Public Works, Utilities and ACC worked together to stabilize the area and continue tunneling without any closure to the ditch or loss of water service to the community. In the Ponds A and B area concrete work is starting on the headwalls, wingwalls and retaining wall this week. Concrete pours are scheduled for these features beginning next week and continuing into August.
- The Public Works Traffic Operations:
 - The team is working through the annual traffic signal preventative maintenance and is approximately 50% complete. Some of the tasks associated with signal maintenance include changing filters in the traffic cabinet, ensuring proper operation of all signal components, cleaning of detection cameras and checking to see if signal detection is functioning properly. The maintenance is performed at all 48 City owned and operated traffic signals.
 - The Traffic Team worked alongside the City Traffic Engineering Manager Adam Maxwell to improve signage on S Bannock Street between US 285 and W Oxford Avenue. The enhancements improve conditions for road users by adding additional Do Not Enter and Wrong Way signs that provide additional emphasis and alert drivers of the one-way road condition. The new signs reinforce existing signs that already alert motorists of the one-way operation along the corridor.



- Dartmouth Bridge: This week they are finishing up the east abutment on the north side, shoring and excavating for pier 2, and potholing for signal poles on the west intersection. Next week they will begin to drive piles and pour concrete for pier 2 and the west abutment.



- **South Platte Renew**

- On Tuesday, July 16th, South Platte Renew's (SPR) Operations Challenge team participated in the Regional Operations Challenge Competition, testing their knowledge, skills, and abilities in a series of timed wastewater events. These events simulate real-world challenges faced in wastewater treatment facilities. The SPR team earned second place in the Laboratory event and will advance to compete at the national competition at WEFTEC, the Annual Technical Exhibition & Conference of the Water Environment Federation, in New Orleans, Louisiana. Through this competition, participants highlight the critical role of efficient wastewater management, fostering teamwork, and promoting best practices within the water sector.
