### DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

- **City Manager's Office**
  - The Bridge House Ready to Work facility is under construction and expected to be completed by November providing 50 beds year round for the job training program and 25 temporary beds for the navigation center.



- The City was awarded \$179,000 from the Charge Ahead Colorado grant to go towards installing five public electric vehicle charging stations throughout the city. This would fulfill one of the goal areas listed in the city's Electric Vehicle Action Plan.

  - Englewood Trolley – There were 4,886 riders of the Englewood Trolley in July, including 366 persons who accessed the service using wheelchairs.

- Parks crews have closed all grills in the parks due to the stage 2 fire ban. No open flames will be allowed in the parks or open space areas.
- Phase II at Bates Logan started on Monday. This week includes finalizing grading stakes. Information signs will be put up to describe this phase and the timeline.
- The Englewood Summer Drama program wrapped up their 58<sup>th</sup> year with a performance of 42<sup>nd</sup> Street on July 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>. Over the three shows, 1057 tickets were sold. To celebrate the shows completion, the cast and crew had a cast party at Duncan Park.





- Santa came to the Farm & Train on Friday, July 26<sup>th</sup>. It was also Buy One Get One free day at the Farm & Train to celebrate Parks & Rec month. Kids got to visit with Santa, write letters to him, enjoy all the decorations and free crafts. There were over 700 visitors throughout the day!





- The Farm & Train also hosted two sensory friendly times in July and will have two more in August (August 18<sup>th</sup> & August 29<sup>th</sup>) at 9am.
- Pirates Cove will go to being open weekends only on Saturday August 10<sup>th</sup> to Labor Day.
- July at Broken Tee was a record month with \$562,956 in revenue.
- The Broken Tee Master Plan is nearing completion and will be presented at a Council Study Session in September.
- Malley Recreation Center is currently displaying artwork from the current Drawing & Painting class. Students create art in pencil, charcoal, acrylic and watercolor paint as well as colored pencils.



- **Police**

- Last weekend, we had the honor of partnering with the Littleton Police Department, the Greenwood Village Police Department, Make-A-Wish Colorado, and mascots from across Colorado to grant a very special wish for four-year-old Christian, who has been bravely battling cancer. We were humbled to be part of his Wish Weekend and so very excited that he and his family just learned his disease is formally in remission! - City of Englewood Open Burning Ban Stage (2) July 30, 2024  
Due to the dry conditions and based upon the Open Burning Ban, the City of Englewood has issued a Stage 2 Fire Ban; which means no fireworks or any other outdoor fires including, but not limited to, campfires, fires in constructed permanent fire pits or fire grates within developed camp and

picnic grounds and recreation sites; charcoal fueled fires, warming fires, fires in outdoor wood burning stoves (chimney sparks or embers); the prescribed burning of fence lines, fence rows, fields, farmlands, range lands, wild lands, trash and debris

## **OPEN BURNING BAN STAGE 2**

No fireworks or any other outdoor fires including, but not limited to, campfires, fires in constructed, permanent fire pits; fire grates within developed camp and picnic grounds and recreation sites; charcoal fueled fires, warming fires, fires in outdoor wood-burning stoves (chimney sparks or embers) ; the prescribed burning of fence lines, fence rows, fields, farmlands, range lands, wildlands, trash and debris.

- **Public Works**

- The Public Works Stormwater team completed routine maintenance to clean and remove sediment/debris from the SW Greenbelt. 25 cubic yards of sediment and debris were removed. Last time maintenance was performed on the SW greenbelt was in August 2023 by City staff and over 130 cubic yards of debris was removed. Regular maintenance is essential to keeping our drainage ways functioning properly during a storm event to protect properties. The team also began a project to inspect catch basins throughout the city and replace “No Dumping, Drains to River” labels on catch basins that have worn or missing labels. Storm drain marking is a requirement of the City’s MS4 permit to educate the public on where

storm water goes to promote best practices and reduce illicit discharges.

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Update: This past week has been busy at Site B! Excavation at Ponds A and B are progressing with the head, wing and retaining walls all going in smoothly. The tunnel work is moving forward, working through some soil. See photo below from last Friday, showing the first pass of the two-pass method. This tunnel is larger than the pipe's diameter and will remain in place as the structural pipe is installed. After the structural pipe is installed, it will be grouted in place to fill the voids between the smaller 78" (ID) structural pipe and the larger 96" (OD) diameter beam and lagging.



- **Utilities**

- The new Utilities customer portal went live on August 1<sup>st</sup>. Customers are now able to pay on-line or register for auto-pay with their new account number from their August bill. Utilities billing staff addressed over 200 customer calls related to the new billing system and providing customer account numbers on August 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Daily customer interactions are being tracked by the billing staff, and generally over 95% of these interactions have been positive or neutral.
- AMI Program Update:

- As of 8/1, the AMI contractor has exchanged or retrofitted a total of 2,917 meters.
  - Customer interactions are being tracked by the contractor, and 89% of customers have a positive or neutral perception of the program.
- Lead Program Update:
  - The contractor is continuing to verify the service line material for pre-1960 properties in the North Central Zone (about 50% complete as of last week). Of the 660 service lines verified through 7/27, about 40% require replacement. This is consistent with the machine learning modeling that was performed after the initial field verification performed last fall.
  - Customer interactions over the last month have totaled 277, and almost 99% of customers have a positive or neutral perception of the program. Customers have said the following over the last week:
    - I had the real pleasure of speaking with Kylie with the lead reduction program for Englewood today. She was helpful, cheerful, knowledgeable and adept. She helped me with all kinds of information for the reduction program, impacts, and timing for the proposed work. Kylie is an excellent asset for this project, and a wonderful face (voice!) for the program. Congratulations. Everyone we have been in touch with in this great effort by the City of Englewood has been just terrific.
    - Owner Mary, spoke very highly of the program and made point to mention how kind and well-spoken Justin was during her in home inspection. She said she was a small bit confused about the number of mailings in terms of the acknowledgement form but also said that it's better to have more information than not enough.
    - One customer that has called 3-4 times to give a glowing review of AGL as they just potholed her house and the rest of the street. They went above and beyond to make sure lines were verified especially for her elderly neighbors that were unable to get out to chat with the contractor but they potholed the customer-side twice to triple confirm it was all copper to make them feel assured.
- The Lead Reduction Program is scheduled to replace 25 lead or galvanized service lines next week. The majority of these replacements will occur along the 3000 block of S. Clarkson Street and the 2700 block of S Emerson Street.
- As a part of the Lead Reduction Program, the program manager continuously updates the Service Line Inventory Map as the material of service lines in the water service area is physically verified. This map is publicly available [here](#).
