- **Administration City Manager's Office**
  - CMO and Finance worked with the Leadership Team to finalize recommendations for the 2025 City budget which Council will review on Monday.
- **City Clerk's Office**
  - Two citizen initiative petitions for charter amendments were filed with the City Clerk's office on August 7, 2024. Per State Statute, the City Clerk will issue a written determination that the petitions are sufficient or insufficient within 15 working days after the filing of the petition. The deadline to determine sufficiency is August 28, 2024. If petitions are deemed sufficient, Council shall set the ballot title for the proposed amendments at its next meeting. City Clerk must certify all ballot language with Arapahoe County by September 6, 2024.

The crews came in at 2:30am and worked quickly to finish before the morning rush-hour. Staff removed 12 yards of sand, salt, and dirt from the walks.

- A new scoreboard and clock will be installed in the Malley gymnasium next week.
- The Adult summer reading program is breaking records. Over 200 adults have registered for the program. To date 85 tier 1 prizes have been distributed and 74 for tier 2 prizes!

- o Malley Recreation Center visited the Pollywog Station Lavender Farm & Apiary in Parker on August 8<sup>th</sup>.

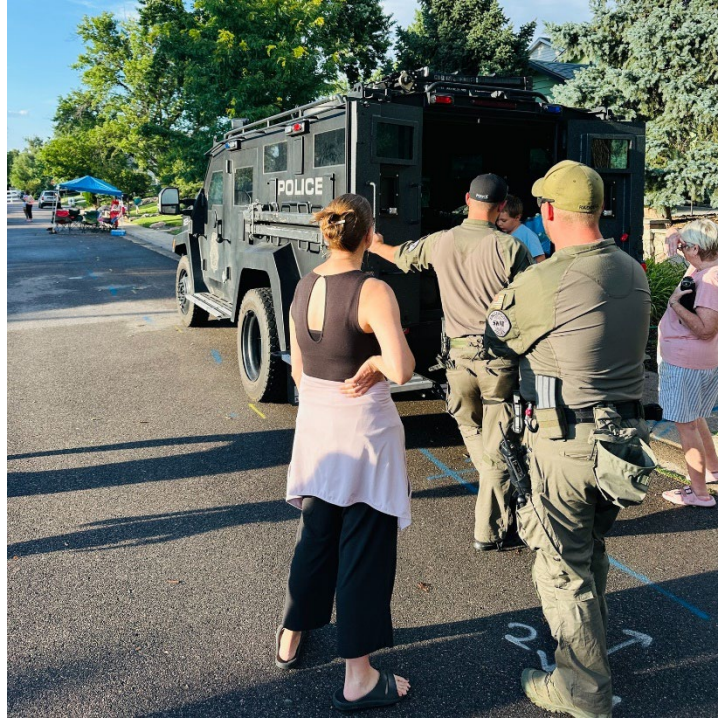


- **Police**

Our Officers and Detectives, alongside DFD Firefighters and ARP Members, enjoyed connecting with the community and showing off some of our cool vehicles.

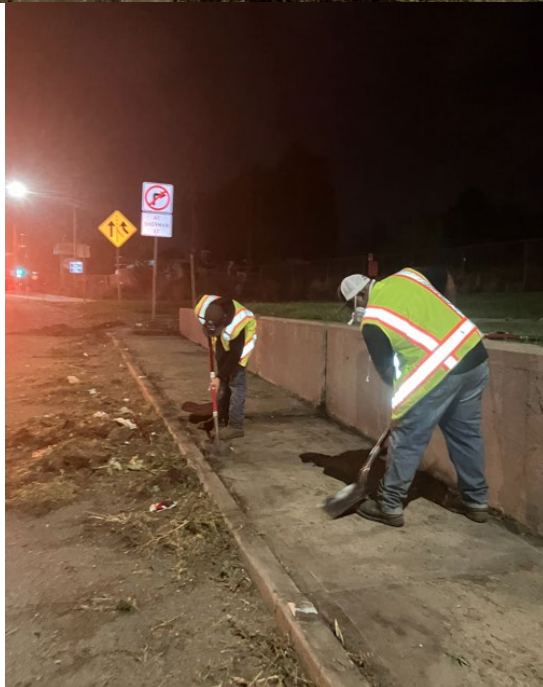






- **Public Works**

- As noted in the Parks section of this report, Parks and Public Works teamed up to remove weeds, sand, and debris under Broadway at 285. This work was done in the early morning hours before the AM traffic rush. Below are a few additional photos of the work they completed together.





- One of our new Public Works Streets team members, Levi Walker, completed the necessary training / testing and received his Class B Commercial Driver's License (CDL) this week.
- Dartmouth Bridge Update - Abutment 1 will be poured next week, Pier 2 pier cap will be poured the week after. The contractor will then they will begin preparing to set the girders the last week of August / first week of September. See photo below:



- **South Platte Renew**

- On Thursday, August 1, South Platte Renew's (SPR) Outreach and Marketing Administrator visited Littleton Primrose School to deliver water educational information to over 30 children aged 4 to 7. Classroom engagement is a key component of SPR's outreach strategy, aimed at enhancing environmental literacy and promoting water education within the community.

- **Utilities**

- The new Utilities customer portal went live on August 1st. Customers are now able to pay on-line or register for auto-pay with their new account number from their August bill. Utilities customer service staff continues to handle a large volume of calls from customers requesting their account numbers in advance of receiving their August bills.

- **AMI Program Update**

- As of August 9<sup>th</sup>, the AMI contractor has exchanged or retrofitted a total of 3,307 meters.

- **Lead Program Update:**

- The Lead Reduction Program is scheduled to replace 24 lead or galvanized service lines next week. The majority of these replacements will continue along the 3000 block of Clarkson St and along the 2700 block of Emerson Street.
    - The contractor is also beginning replacements for customers that have previously paid to convert from flat rate to metered service and have been on a waitlist until the Lead Reduction Program kicked off. Once the service line is replaced, Utilities staff will install a new water meter at these addresses.
    - As a part of the Lead Reduction Program, the program manager continuously updates the Service Line Inventory Map as the material of service lines in the water service area is physically verified. This map is publicly available [here](#).
