




- Implemented random surveys on IT Service Request tickets closed. The survey is intended to monitor user experience with IT staff. We encourage everyone to respond. We need your feedback!

# • Parks, Recreation, Library and Golf

 Belleview Farm is excited to announce the birth of two kids! Staff have anxiously waited all summer for their arrival! The new goats can be viewed up until Labor Day before they go back to their farm with their mom.



- The Belleview Farm's last day will be Labor Day, Monday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>. The Belleview Train will remain in service, on weekends through the end of September.
- Book Drop Update: The circle book drops on the north side of the Civic Center have been relocated. One has been moved into the parking garage, as they are preparing a drive-up book drop. There will be brand new signage, and they will be painting the lines around it.
- Fall Book Sale: The sale itself will take place on Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Friday, September 13<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. The final day of the sale will be a \$5/bag sale. On Tuesday, September 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Library will actively accept donations.

- A new working score board and clock have been installed in the Malley Gymnasium. Thank you to Public Works for the installation of the new board!

- The Recreation Center will be <u>closed</u> Monday August 26<sup>th</sup> Monday September 2<sup>nd</sup> for annual maintenance. The pool will close at Noon on Sunday August 25<sup>th</sup>.
- Summer reading has come to an end. The children's program had 744 participants with a 61% completion rate! The children's team offered 130 programs with 3359 total attendees. The highest attended program was the foam party with 163 attendees. There were 26 volunteers helping with the children's summer reading program who contributed a total of 438 volunteer hours this summer. The adult program had 205 participants. A total of four programs were offered with a total of 120 attendees. Congratulations to the library staff for a very successful summer!
- o Pirates Cove last day of the season is Monday Labor Day September 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- Bates Logan playground and basketball court have been removed. Prep for the new basketball court will start next week. Unfortunately, some trees needed to be removed to make room for the larger playground and new basketball court. Staff tries to work around as many trees as possible during our design process. The good news is that we are adding a total of 20 new trees for this Phase of the project. We will be adding the following trees to Bates Logan: 5 Fall Fiesta Sugar Maples, 3 Sunburst Honey Locust, 5 Prairie fire Crabapples, 5 Exclamation London Plane Trees, 2 Ivory Silk Japanese Tree Lilac.

 Consultants are working on updating the park renovation plans for Rotolo Park. Input is being requested on what renovations the residents would like to see to this park. An <u>online survey</u> is available to provide input on the future of this park.

#### Public Works

- South Englewood Flood Reduction Update Over in the pond areas there was no scheduled concrete work this week, but excavation continues. We'll see things pick up next week with the commencement of terrace wall work. The box culvert installation is making its way into Navajo and will be working its way towards Stanford over the next +/-3 months with paving estimated to be before Thanksgiving. At the tunnel they have entered bedrock and have recently been progressing at the scheduled rate of about 20 horizontal feet per day utilizing only a daytime crew. About 300 feet of the first pass of the tunnel has been excavated at this time.
- The Public Works Streets team is working with the city's internal nuisance abatement team to address trash dumping on Pecos St (Alley). Current discussions are to gate the location and ensure fire / police have access. As part of the project, outreach to the adjacent businesses is currently being conducted. Below is a photo of some of the recent dumping in the alley.

# o AMI Program Update

 As of August 22<sup>nd</sup>, the AMI contractor has exchanged or retrofitted a total of 3,730 meters.

# o Lead Program Update:

- As of August 22<sup>nd</sup>, the Lead Reduction Program contractor has replaced 67 lead service lines in Englewood.
- The Lead Reduction Program is scheduled to replace 24 lead or galvanized service lines next week. The majority of these

- replacements will occur along the 3200, 3300 and 3400 blocks of Grant Street.
- There are approximately 17 businesses along Broadway in the Northcentral Zone with lead service lines. Replacements of these service lines will begin next week and continue through mid to late August, prior to the Public Works mill and overlay project in this area.
- As a part of the Lead Reduction Program, the program manager continuously updates the Service Line Inventory Map as the material of service lines in the water service area is physically verified. This map is publicly available here.
