## • Community Development

- EARN Awards App The EARN Awards small business purchasing app has 479 active users as of September 9. 162 businesses are participating in the program and there have been just under 300 transactions, with approximately \$1,600 distributed as awards. The app was launched on August 1. For comparison, Littleton has had the app in place for approximately one year and has about 1,500 registered users.
- Englewood Trolley Ridership in August was 5,180 patrons, including 416 patrons who utilized wheelchairs.

- VOA Meal program has capped weekly meals at Malley Recreation Center to 170 due to resource constraints. Communication between Volunteers of America and Malley Recreation Center staff is strong, and consideration for capacity increase is being considered.


 $_{\odot}$  Pirates Cove is in winterization mode with the pools being drained and preparing for the lines to be blown out next week.



The Recreation Center received new cardio equipment on September 12<sup>th</sup> & 13<sup>th</sup>. Equipment included Free Motion upright bikes, stationary bikes, and treadmills which have an interactive touch screen to access ondemand.







- The Colorado Room is back open after floor damage was identified during the Recreation Center Renovation. The flooring has been patched and the room is ready to host dance classes and rentals.
- The Parks department was busy removing and painting over graffiti throughout the city, parks, and along Little Dry Creek.
- Parks staff have worked with Excel Energy on pole replacement in and around Centennial Park. Excel will be replacing 5 poles and two transformers. The work shouldn't cause any issue for the park users.
- Library Fall Book Sale: The sale is taking place on Thursday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 7:30 p.m., Friday, September 13<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and Saturday, September 14<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. The final day of the sale will be a \$5/bag sale.
- The Train will remain open through September on the weekends from 9:30am-1:30pm. Rides are \$3 per person.

### Public Works

- Public Works, in coordination with the Clerk's Office, successfully moved the city's mailbox / mail delivery location to in front of the north entrance of the Civic Center. This has been an almost year long process and is now complete.
- Public Works reached out to Englewood Schools and is coordinating with them on the upcoming Walk and Roll (Wheel) event in October. Additional details will be provided as the program comes together / is formalized.

 Three new team members in the Public Works Fleet division started this past Monday. For the first time in over 2 years, the Fleet team is now fully staffed.

 As of September 12<sup>th</sup>, the AMI contractor has exchanged or retrofitted a total of 4,434meters.

### Lead Program Update:

- Lead line replacements along S Broadway in the Northcentral zone will be completed next week.
- The Lead Reduction Program is scheduled to replace 25 lead or galvanized service lines next week. The majority of these replacements will occur along the 2700 blocks of S Pearl St, 2800 block of S Clarkson Cir, and the 2700 block of S Logan St.
- As a part of the Lead Reduction Program, the program manager continuously updates the Service Line Inventory Map as the material of service lines in the water service area is physically verified. This map is publicly available here.
